

Love

Stewardship

Stewardship defined is a person who manages another's property or financial affairs; one who administers anything as the agent of another or others.'

We believe in the biblical teachings of tithes and offering as expressed in Old Testament Scripture which holds every believer accountable to God for placing the first fruits measured by scripture as (10%) of earnings back to God's work. Our Philosophy of Christian Life

Private Devotion and Prayer

In Romans 12:1-2, Paul reminds the Roman Christians exactly how important it is to change their way of thinking. In fact, he orders them to be "transformed by the renewing of your mind." This takes place when we put our old thinking behind us and make God's mind our own. Reading the Bible everyday is indispensable to this process. Prayer, too, is immeasurably important. God has ordained that communion with Him happen within the precincts of prayer. See Luke 18:1-8; 2 Timothy 2:15; 2 Peter 3:18.
